MAN PLEADS IN “CRITICAL MASS” KNIFE CASE

FLINT -- A man who was charged in a Thanksgiving Day knife attack in a Grand Blanc Twp. mobile home park pleaded no contest today in Genesee County Circuit Court, according to Prosecutor David Leyton.

Jeremy B. Key, 25, of Grand Blanc Twp., pleaded to the charge of assault with intent to do great bodily harm less than murder which is a felony that carries a sentence of not more than 10 years in prison or a fine of not more than \$5,000.

According to Prosecutor Leyton, Key assaulted a 24-year-old man who was visiting his sister at her home in a mobile home park off Maple Road in the early morning hours of November 23, 2006. Leyton said that he used a very unusual and deadly weapon known as a “Critical Mass” knife in the attack. The “Critical Mass” knife has two 10.75 inch double sided, razor sharp blades and two smaller adjacent blades and a metal studded handle grip. It can be purchased on the internet for about 70 bucks, according to Prosecutor Leyton.

A sentencing date for Key in Circuit Court has been scheduled for April 5th.
