## Two men to be arraigned in Flint slaying

**FLINT** - Warrants authorized by Prosecutor David Leyton charging two Flint men in the shooting death of a man found on Third Avenue early on the morning of Nov. 15 were signed by a Flint District judge Friday afternoon.

The warrants, sworn by Sgt. Mike Angus of the Flint Police Department, charge Frederick O. Williams, 33, with an open count of murder and Curtis J. Darrough, 54, with being accessory to murder after the fact. They also are charged with firearms violations.

They are accused in the death of Anthony Carter, 34, of Flint who was found shot to death after a confrontation on Third Avenue near Stevenson Street. The men were arrested Thursday, police said.

The men are expected to be arraigned on the charges in this weekend.

Carter and the two suspects had criminal records.

Carter was on parole for a 2003 conviction for assault with a dangerous weapon.

Darrough has previous convictions for crimes ranging from carrying a concealed weapon and burning a dwelling house in the 1980s to an assault with a dangerous weapon charge in 2001.

Williams has convictions from the 1990s on into the current decade for weapons violations, felony assault and fleeing from police.
